

HOW DO I START A BUSINESS IN NORTH STONINGTON?

The Town Planner will help determine whether your proposed business is a permitted Use in the Zone that the business will be located, and will guide you through the appropriate application process. The Zoning Regulations (available on line) will indicate whether a Site Plan or a Special Permit is required for your particular business in a given Zone. Permit type may vary per Zone. For example, a Motor vehicle Dealership requires Site Plan approval in the Highway Commercial Zone, but requires a Special Permit to locate in the Commercial Development Zone. Keep in mind that though some uses may be permitted in a particular Zone, if a particular parcel within that Zone happens to be in the Aquifer Protection Area, that use may be conditional or prohibited all together. (See Section 1104 Aquifer Protection Regulations)

If your business is going to be conducted at home, you must apply for a **Home Occupation**. Note: There are two classifications of Home Occupations. A Class I Home Occupation requires a Zoning Permit and is approved administratively by the ZEO. A Class II HO requires Site Plan approval by the Planning & Zoning Commission. The ZEO will help you make the determination as to which standard applies. (See Section 1426)

If you are moving into an existing commercial, industrial, or office space, a **Change of Use** Application is required as well as a sign permit for any new signs. If you are moving into an existing space and the type of business will remain the same, then a Change of User Application must be filled out and approved by the ZEO. (See Section 206)

Site Plan standards are outlined in Section 1700 of the Zoning regulations and include basic design criteria as well as reference to applicable landscaping (Section 1800), lighting (Section 1506), and parking requirements (Section 1900).

All signage related to the Business must comply with the **Signage** Regulations set forth in Section 2000 of the Zoning regulations

BUSINESS TRADE NAME INFORMATION

Any person(s) conducting business under a name other than their own in the Town of North Stonington **shall** file a Trade Name Certificate with the Town Clerk. Each certificate will state the name of the business, full name of each person(s) conducting such business or authorized officer thereof, post-office address and acknowledged under oath prior to submitting to the Town Clerk. Your original trade certificate may be mailed along with a fee of \$5.00. You may request a certified copy for an additional \$3.00. Our mailing address is 40 Main St., North Stonington, CT 06359.

Filing of Trade Name Certificates **does not** protect the business name. To protect the business name you must register with the Secretary of the State. 
