Minutes from 3/6/18 meeting reviewed and approved.

- 1. Determination to have committee present general ideas and funding sources (grants) at Town Meeting in May. Resident questionnaire to be tabled until after May meeting.
- 2. Decision made to narrow scope of potential projects.
- a) Short term goals--safe and historically appropriate walkways through village, signage to designate historic district, appropriate lighting, landscaping including trees, determination of zoning flexibility for village
- --Potential of relieving burden and liability of clearing walkways upon property owners via "village district" cost sharing with residents collectively paying for the service
- --Determination of linear feet of walkways, potential to build walkways in stages, cost of different materials, general budget needed for grant seeking.
- b) Long term goals--potential to bury utilities, sewer hookup for village
- c) Tabled for now--speed humps, addressing speeding may be handled alternatively
- 3. Determination required regarding Ledge Light Health District requirements and their potential negative impact upon potential development (commercial and residential) in the village. Modern zoning vs. non-conforming village district
- 4. Discussion regarding fire protection for village. -- Lack of hydrants. -- Location of potential water tower of importance to committee.
- 5. Review of CCM meeting Make Place Matter attended by J. Edwards as representative from North Stonington--summary attached

Make Place Matter workshop 3/29/18 Connecticut Conference of Municipalities--West Hartford Town Hall

Meeting led by Courtney Hendricson--VP Municipal Services at CT Economic Resource Center (CERC) attended by many selectmen/women, town planners, Economic Development Coordinators, various committee members

Jonathan Edwards attended as representative from North Stonington on Historic Translation Village Improvement Committee. Goal is to make the village a safe and vibrant space for our community.

Key Takeaways for creating a <u>Place</u> for gathering from a <u>Space</u>--socializing, commerce, strolling etc.

- 1. Space must be safe or people will not use it. Must be safe from crime in particular. Have good lighting and signage
- 2. Access to space--safe sidewalks for handicapped / strollers etc., bike lanes. Calm traffic patterns. Must be walkable.
- 3. Space must have an anchor for activity--schools, churches, town hall, libraries, shops--all anchors
- 4. Get feed back from the local population about what <u>they want</u>. 2 meetings minimum--one Saturday morning, one weekday evening. Leave comment board in town hall.
- 5. Find key partners--business, key supporters, others
- 6. Short term improvements--Do Not Wait to Start...start small and see what happens.
- 7. Involve Public Works--ex. Planting beds, ask businesses to provide funding for planting / upkeep
- 8. Mixed use zoning a must--stronger neighborhood character with mix of residence and appropriate businesses and cultural institutions
- 9. When possible enhance your tax base
- 10. Know what you want your community to look like before development
- 11. Hidden Assets--which can be leveraged, don't neglect historic architecture but perhaps add a modern flair or twist, target underperforming / vacant space.
- 12. Bring in unique businesses when possible that won't be pushed out by Amazon

Yale Urban Design Workshop--resource to help with planning to create the <u>Place</u> you are envisioning. Helps with master planning. **Old Lyme** just approved funding for their project. Money allocated--Approximately **\$20,000.00** for larger project than North Stonington. Made a good contact with Old Lyme officials.
